EuReCa ONE – 27 NATIONS, ONE EUROPE, ONE MONTH

A prospective data analysis over one month in 27 resuscitation registries in Europe

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Background

- Incidence, likelihood of resuscitation, and outcomes from out-of-hospital cardiac arrest (OHCA) vary across Europe
- A European, multi-centre study may provide explanations for these differences
- This study will involve **27 EUROPEAN COUNTRIES**

Aim


- The aim of EuReCa ONE is to:
 - Understand differences in incidence and outcomes from OHCA in Europe by comparing the epidemiology, treatment, and survival from OHCA across Europe
 - Use the data gathered to facilitate improved outcome from OHCA.

Governance and Management

- EuReCa ONE is governed by a Steering Group from the European Resuscitation Council (ERC) and is administered and conducted by a European Study Management Team
- EuReCa ONE is registered with ClinicalTrials.gov (Registration Number: NCT02236819)

Patients and Methods

- Every patient who suffers OHCA is attended and/or treated by an emergency medical service and documented in a participating registry during October 2014 will be included
- The study dataset was developed in accordance with the Utstein template
- All data will be submitted by National Coordinators in each participating country to the EuReCa ONE database in anonymised format





Progress and Plans

- This large and unique study has already succeeded in gaining the collaboration of 27 European countries
- It is the starting point for a pan-European registry of OHCA that can potentially serve as a support to quality benchmarking across the continent

Data Analysis: The EuReCa ONE Steering Committee and Study Management Team will meet in Dresden in March to begin data analysis. Activities for this two-day meeting will include finalisation of the data analysis plan in consultation with statistical experts and preparation of the write-up strategy for the Study. The structure and content of the EuReCa ONE meeting at the Utstein Abbey in Stavanger, Norway will be agreed at the Dresden meeting.
